


membership status of existing members.

# Rear Commodores' Report

TECH TIPS - BATTERIES

Batteries – most boats have them. The two main types are starter batteries and deep cycle batteries.

Starter Batteries: the battery used to start the engine and should not be used for house loads (ie. Lights, fridge, radio, etc.).

Deep Cycle batteries: the battery best used for constant loads (house loads) and will stand deeper discharge than a starter battery.

Battery Facts:

The flooded cell lead acid battery is the most common and cost effective.

The main difference between a starter battery and a deep cycle battery is the thickness and number of plates. The energy from a lead acid battery is produced from surface area, hence more plates in a starter battery will give larger amounts of energy for a shorter period of time.

The deep cycle battery has fewer but thicker plates so it will withstand deeper discharge but release energy at a slower rate. Next comes the gel filled battery. The electrolyte is suspended in a gel. These batteries require less maintenance.

The last but not least is the AGM (absorbed Glass Mat). They are sealed and the electrolyte is suspended in a glass mat which supports the plates. They can operate in any position and they do not vent and are by far the most expensive, but will take a higher rate of charge.

Batteries last longer if they are kept fully charged, so it is important to use a 3 stage charger as batteries discharge even without a load.





## **RULES**

## West Kelowna Yacht Club Golf Tournament - August 29, 2015

We will use a modified best ball format on all holes. IE: Each player on a team will drive from the proper tee box (men from the white and ladies from the red markers). Select the best tee shot and go to that ball (pick up the other 3 balls). The person whose tee shot was the "best" shot, cannot hit the next shot, only the other 3 players. You now select the best of those 3 shots, and all four players can play from there. All four players continue best ball play to the green. All four

players can putt when your team gets on the green. Choose the ball closest to the pin to putt from. Mark your team score on your card after each hole. *Please keep your team moving at a comfortable speed*. Clear the green quickly at each hole and move to the next tee box before marking your card.

# NO personal liquor or beer is allowed on the course!!

### Hole #

- 1. <u>Paynter's Market hole</u> Please do not move anything you find on the green.
- 2. All tee shots must be taken with an opposite side club (ie. Right handed golfers must use a left handed club for their tee shot only) and vice versa for lefties. Men and women tee off from the RED markers. A right handed and left handed driver will be on the tee for you to use if you like (LEAVE THEM THERE).
- 3. Closest drive to the white bumper.
- 4. All drives take from the red tees and you MUST be seated in the provided chair when you hit your ball.

- 5. <u>Five Iron Only Hole</u> all players are to use only a five iron (no hybrids or 5 woods allowed) for the ENTIRE hole (ie drive, fairway, chips and putting).
- 6. Men and ladies closest to the pin on *the drive*.
- 7. Water Hole when teams get on the green, <u>all</u> putts are to be taken with <u>one</u> hand only.
- 8. Ladies and men's longest drives drives must be on the fairway.
- 9. \$10,000 Hole in One sponsored by the WKYC. (2<sup>nd</sup> person to get a hole in one gets \$5,000).

# Bar Directors' Report

ow – August – September Log already. It has been a hot summer already and hopefully more nice weather to come for a few months.

We have been working hard to ensure good service and a variety of products for our members and guests.

We have been trying out a variety of wines by the bottle and by the glass to see what is popular. We are also working on having draft beer taps at both stations and streamlined taps for beer and house wines. Once we have this in place we will be offering one house white, one house red and two draft beers. We will also do a feature wine by the glass for both white and red which will showcase some of our local wineries. We thank you for your comments on the wines we have been trying. Selecting house wines is always a difficult task as we all like different varieties and brands. Your constructive comments are always appreciated.

I know some of you have experienced frustrations when setting up your tab for the evening and when paying your tab, so I would like to give a brief explanation of our point of sale system and its idiosyncrasies and limitations. As you all know we are a small club with a limited budget. We were able to purchase the Chevy Sprint model not the Cadillac as the cost of the Cadillac is in excess of \$15,000, an expense we

cannot justify.

As we are using a basic system to track your house accounts and set up tabs for you upon arrival – we have two ways of accessing your account – 1. By using your phone number (which of course is sometimes difficult as we all have several phone numbers). or 2. By your last name – unfortunately these do not come up alphabetically all the time (a problem we are asking the supplier to rectify).

Once we set up your tab, we can no longer find your tab by your phone number and we must look for your name (again by sequence number not by alphabetical), so depending on the number of tabs in the system this can take a minute or two.

I know you will say small restaurants have better systems – the answer is: most small restaurants and bars have servers so they will set your tab up by Table number and can retrieve it by Table number which, of course, is much quicker. We cannot do this as we do not have servers.

We are working with our supplier to find a work around for these issues and will continue to do so.

We explain this to you, not as an excuse, but to make you all aware of why it takes time to find your tab at this time. Of course systems are more complex in
