



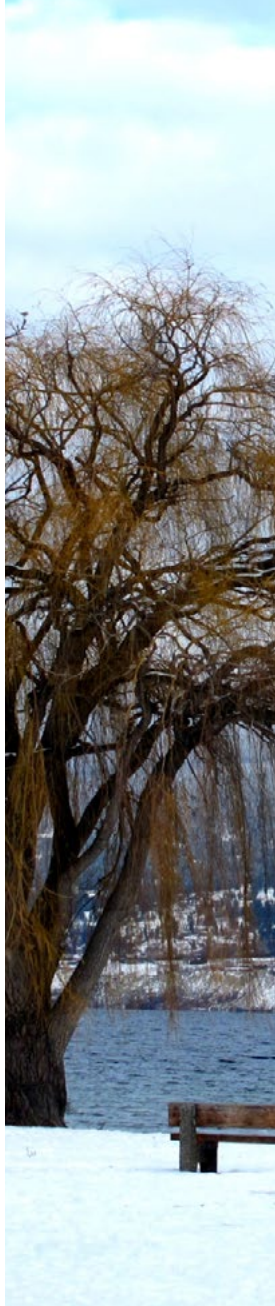

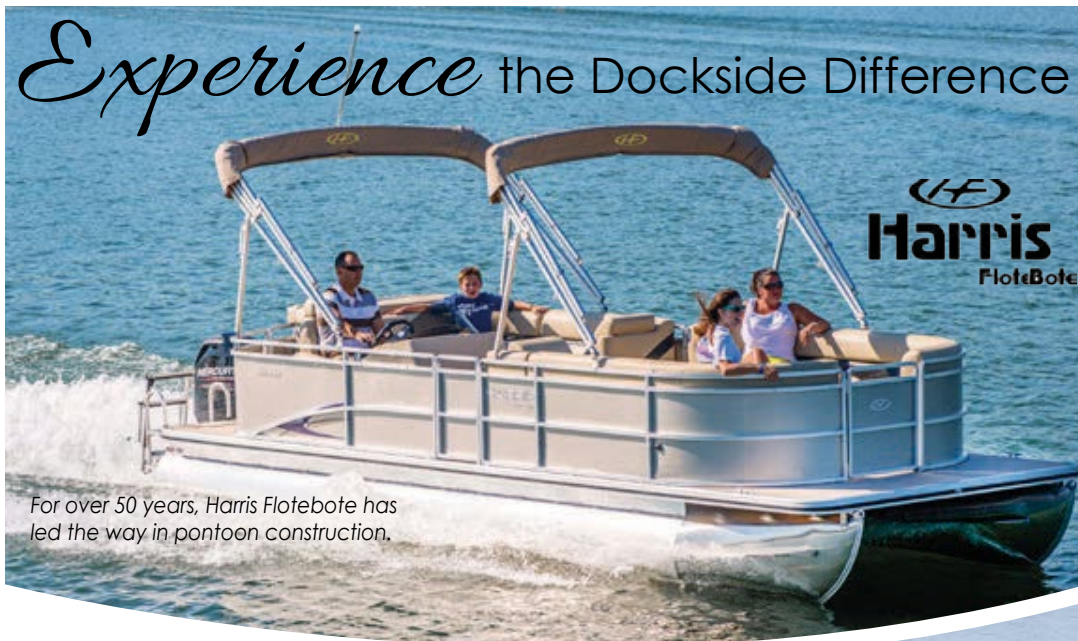
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Ship's Log

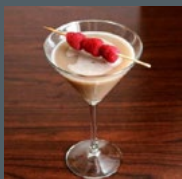

CHOCOLATE RASPBERRY MARTINI



- 1 ounce raspberry vodka
- 1 ounce dark creme de cacao
- 1 ounce cream
- 1/2 ounce Tia Maria

Fill a cocktail shaker halfway with ice cubes. Pour in the ingredients and shake until chilled. Strain the mixture into a martini glass. Garnish with raspberries and/or chocolate.

You can garnish this one in a few ways: put a few fresh raspberries in it, sprinkle cocoa powder across the surface; put a chocolate kiss or two in it; or any combination of the above. You can also rim the glass with sweetened cocoa powder. Or just skewer some raspberries and lay them across the top, it looks elegant and clean.

MOORAGE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

NOV. 2016 ENTRY ... A. PATTERSON & A. JAMES

Update and report from AGM.

As you are all aware we had a bad storm last Nov 19th that did substantial damage to the marina basin. We made emergency repairs to ensure the marina was safe. Then we proceeded with the long process of filing an insurance claim, meeting with adjusters, getting quotes to repair the damage, working with adjusters to visually identify storm damage that they were initially not going to cover. We would like to thank Pat Pope for all his assistance with the insurance adjuster and for attending the many meetings required to finalize our claim to the best advantage for the club. The breakwater was not covered by insurance, apparently this is very common, so the breakwater repairs to the vertical boards and some pilings are a club expense.

Throughout the summer we completed most of the storm damage repairs as well as some general maintenance repairs required. The breakwater has been repaired during the month of October as the contractor had to wait until the lake water was low so these could take place.

F Dock is our greatest concern at this time. F Dock walkway and breakwater needs replacement. We have held off moving the sediment that came from the park beach during the storm until we have low water and a total plan in place to replace this section so that all work can be done simultaneously. The rebuilding of F Dock requires an outlay of \$260,000; we do have a small amount of insurance proceeds left to be applied to this cost.

This will enable us to remove the first section of F Dock – to the jog, and install concrete lock blocks to the water line and then install steel vertical beams with concrete panels between them, very similar to the Safe Harbour at Okanagan Center. While we are rebuilding F Dock it will give us the opportunity to remove the sediment. To remove this sediment we will have to work with The City of West Kelowna.

We feel the best long term plan of action for our continued maintenance and upgrading of the marina basin is to engage a marine engineering company to assist with future design and a long term plan. Our insurance company does require a long term plan and maintenance budget. To engage in this process would definitely show due diligence on our part. We received a quotation from Advisian, the same engineering company who did the survey for the dock damage - so they are familiar already with the club. This quote is for \$22,000, to do a site visit and prepare a plan with several options of design recommendations. We are convinced that this is the way to go and to have a long term engineered plan would be a great asset to WKYC. This expenditure was approved at the AGM and we will be doing a site visit with the Engineer mid-November to start this process.

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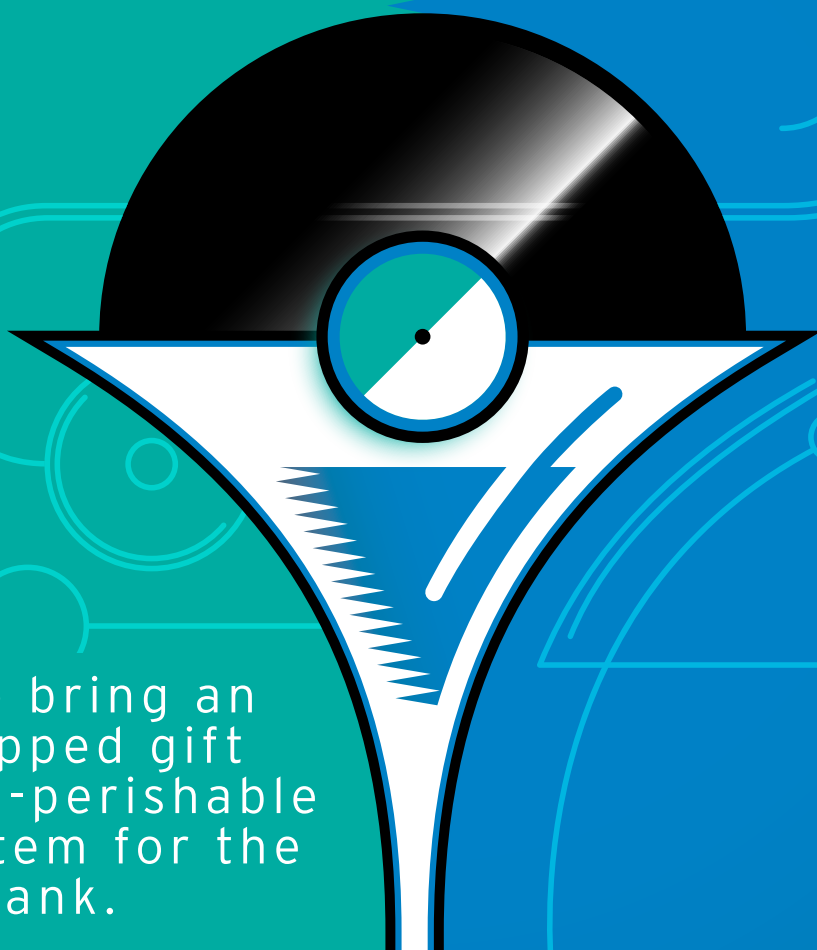

Gale's GALLEY

COMFORT WINTER CHOWDER

serves 10 generously

6 slices of bacon – coarsely chopped; can use turkey bacon for less fat, or 8-10 tbsp. of real bacon bits

4 teaspoons of olive oil

2 onions chopped – white or sweet

2 red bell peppers – seeded and diced

2 pounds all purpose potatoes – peeled and diced; or use 32oz of canned potatoes if you prefer

8 cups chicken broth (low sodium if you prefer)

½ teaspoon of salt (or to taste)

½ teaspoon of paprika

2 – 15 oz cans of whole kernel corn – drained

2 – 14 ¾ oz cans creamed style corn

2 cups fat free or regular evaporated milk

4 – 6 drops hot pepper sauce

4 cans crab meat – drained or vacu packed crab to equal 10 – 16 oz.

4 tablespoons chopped scallions (4-6 green onions)

DIRECTIONS

1. Heat a small non stick skillet over medium high heat. Add the bacon and cook until crisp. Transfer bacon to paper towel to drain. Set aside until drained and cooled – crumble. Or you can use bacon bits.

2. Heat oil in a large non-stick sauce pan over medium-high heat. Add the onions and the bell peppers and cook, stirring frequently for about 6 minutes until softened. Add the potatoes, broth, salt, paprika and bacon bring to a boil. Reduce heat and simmer, covered, until the potatoes are soft, about 20 minutes (with canned potatoes simmer for 5 minutes)

3. Add the corn, creamed corn, evaporated milk, crab, and hot pepper sauce, return to a boil. Reduce the heat and simmer, covered for about 2 minutes.

4. Remove from heat and stir in scallions.

For 1 1/3 cup: 246 cal, 5 g Fat, (1 g Sat Fat, 0 trans fat, 7 mg Chol, 627 mg. Of sodium, 43 g crv, 4 g fibre, 14 g protein.

This can be frozen and reheated. For 5 person, cut recipe in half

Note: if you wish to use fresh corn for the kernel corn, one ear of corn will give you about 4 oz of corn kernels.

WHAT OKANAGAN BOATERS NEED TO KNOW ABOUT INVASIVE MUSSELS



Zebra and Quagga mussels are microscopic at birth and the size of your thumbnail at maturity. Despite their small size they will have a huge negative impact if they are introduced into our lakes and rivers.

What would happen?

Unprotected docks, breakwalls, boat bottoms and engines would be rapidly colonized. Boat engines would overheat due to colonies of mussels clogging cooling water intakes. Major, ongoing efforts would be required to scrape mussels off boat hulls.

Walking barefoot along Okanagan beaches could become a thing of the past. The sharp-edged shells of dead mussels wash ashore, creating a cutting hazard for unprotected feet. Since mussels accumulate on the submerged portion of any substrate, ladders, docks and rafts are also a risk.

As significant filter feeders, invasive mussels may increase human and wildlife exposure to pollutants. Research indicates that mussels can accumulate pollutants within their tissues to levels more than 300,000 times greater than concentrations in the environment. These contaminants can be passed up the food chain so that any fish or waterfowl consuming the mussels will also accumulate pollutants. Likewise, human consumption of these same fish and waterfowl could result in further risk of exposure.

These are just some of the reasons why a great effort is being made to keep these mussels out of British Columbia.

History tells us that these aquatic organisms can reproduce, colonize new water bodies and spread across the continent at a rapid pace. It's believed that zebra and quagga mussels were introduced into the Great Lakes in the late 1980's when European ships released ballast water containing the species. The mussels were then discovered attached to the underwater surfaces of rocks and piers and other structures. During the next three decades, they steadily moved into Quebec, many U.S. states and now Manitoba, infesting close to 700 North American lakes.

We all need to take responsibility to protect the Okanagan from the impacts of zebra and quagga mussels. Remember, "Don't Move a Mussel" and "Clean-Drain-Dry" boats and other equipment before moving between lakes and rivers. Taking these steps can prevent the spread of invasive mussels and halt the spread of other invasive animals and plants.

At this time there are no known methods for eliminating invasive mussels without severely damaging the water body in which they've been found. It's essential to have the public's help to prevent their spread. Report mussel-contaminated boats or equipment to the BC Conservation Officer Service's "Report All Poachers and Polluters" (RAPP) Hotline 1-877-952-7277 (toll-free).
