

THE COMMODORE'S REPORT

MAY 2017 ENTRY ··· PAT POPE

It appears that spring has finally arrived in our area. As the weather is improving members are slowly starting to bring their boats into the marina. This is a great time to take a look at the safety equipment both on and off your boat. One area that seems to be often overlooked is the condition of your moorage lines. If the lines are starting to look worn it is probably a good time to replace them. The moorage lines that you attach your boat to the dock with are protecting your boat from breaking free from its slip and potentially causing damage not only to your boat, but other boats and the docks as well. If you are thinking that they may be good enough for one more season chances are they are in need of replacement now. Also check the expiry dates on your flares. Expired flares can be taken to the front desk of the Kelowna RCMP detachment for safe disposal.

An area that many members are unsure of is what to do if you want to purchase a larger boat and require a new slip. The first step is to inform the Harbor Master of your intention to get a larger boat as well as the office and request to be put on the move list. It is important that you advise them of the size of boat that you are considering as well. Once you are on the move list you will be advised when a larger slip becomes available. The Harbor Master will move members on the list in the order that

the member has placed their name on the list and dependent on the slip size available. If you purchase a larger boat and have not followed the proper procedure you may find that there is no slip available for your new boat. The procedure is in place to be fair to all members and ensure that boats are assigned to fit in the proper sized slip.

If you plan on going to other clubs over the summer and require the use of a guest slip check your insurance first. Almost every club on the lake is now requiring you to have a minimum of two million dollars of liability insurance on your boat. Your insurance provider can update your policy at any time if you need to make a change.

The club has been very active over the winter and spring months. There have been many new activities such as card nights and Sunday night dinners. It has been wonderful to see so many members coming out and supporting these events. If you have been thinking about volunteering for an event or to help out with an Anchor club dinner don't hesitate. It is what makes our club successful. The volunteers have fun and get to know more members of the club.

In closing thank you to all the directors for doing a great job, even the smallest job does not go unnoticed and is appreciated.



SAFETY THE ESSENTIALS





MAY ... 2017

This write up is extracted and condensed in part from the Boater Exam publication. It is limited to Water Rescue Equipment for Personal Water Craft (P.W.C.) and boats not over 6 meters Powered and boats 6 meters to not over 12 meters. This and the recommendation from our Commodore (see Commodore's Report) is intended to help get you off to a safe start to the boating season.

Remember to have your boat registration, pleasure craft operators licence and insurance in a safe accessible location.

Water Rescue Equipment: Minimum Required PERSONAL WATER CRAFT:

Personal Protective Equipment

One Government of Canada (Department of Transport) approved personal flotation device (PDF) or life jacket for each person on board.

One buoyant heaving line of not less than 15 meters in length

Boat Safety Equipment:

Paddle or Oars or anchor with not less than 15m of cable, rope or chain. Not required if all on board are wearing a Canadian approved Flotation device of appropriate size.

One bailer. Not required if all on board are wearing a Canadian approved Flotation device of appropriate size.

One Class 5BC fire extinguisher. Not required if all on board are wearing a Canadian approved Flotation device of appropriate size.

Distress Equipment

A watertight flashlight or 3 Canadian approved flares of type A, B or C.

Navigation Equipment:

A sound signaling device or sound signaling appliance audible at distances of one half a marine mile (0.93 km).

It is strongly advised not to operate this type of craft at night.

VESSELS NOT OVER 6M POWERED

Personal Protective Equipment:

The same as applied to P.W.C. (above)

Boat Safety Equipment:

Paddle or Oars or anchor with not less than 15m of cable, rope or chain.

One Class 5BC fire extinguisher (if the craft is equipped with an inboard engine, a fixed fuel tank of any size or a fuel burning cooking, heating, or refrigerating appliance)

One bailer or manual water pump fitted with sufficient hose to enable one person using the pump to pump water from the bilge of the vessel over the side of the vessel.

<u>Distress Equipment:</u>

A watertight flashlight or 3 Canadian approved flares of type A, B or C.

Navigation Equipment:

A sound signaling device or sound signaling appliance audible at distances of one half a marine mile (0.93 km).

Navigation Lights that meet the applicable standards set out in the Collision Regulations if the pleasure craft is operated after sunset and before sunrise or in periods of restricted visibility.

VESSELS OVER 6M BUT NOT OVER 8M

Personal Protective Equipment

One Government of Canada (Department of Transport) approved personal flotation device (PDF) or life jacket for each person on board.

One buoyant heaving line of not less than 15m in length or one approved life buoys with an outside diameter of 610mm or 762mm that is attached to a buoyant line of not less than 15m in length

A re-boarding device if the freeboard of the vessel is greater than 0.5m (freeboard is the distance from the water line to the nearest point water can enter the boat)

Boat Safety Equipment

Paddle or Oars or anchor with not less than 15m of cable, rope or chain

One bailer or manual water pump fitted with sufficient hose to enable a person using the pump to pump water from the bilge of the vessel over the side of the vessel.

One Class BC fire extinguisher, if the pleasure craft is a power driven vessel, plus another Class 5BC fire extinguisher if the pleasure craft is equipped with a fuel burning cooking, heating or refrigerating appliance.

Distress Equipment:

A watertight flashlight

6 Canadian approved flares of type A, B or C.

Navigation Equipment:

A sound signaling device or sound signaling appliance

Navigation Lights that meet the applicable standards set out in the Collision Regulations if the pleasure craft is operated after sunset and before sunrise or in periods of restricted visibility.

VESSELS OVER 8 M BUT NOT OVER 12 M

Personal Protective Equipment:

Same as 6m to 8m (as above)

Boat Safety Equipment:

An anchor with not less than 15m of cable, rope or chain

One Bailer

One manual water pump fitted with or accompanied by sufficient hose to enable a person using the pump to pump water from the bilge of the vessel over the side of the vessel.

One Class 10BC fire extinguisher, if the pleasure craft is a power driven vessel, plus another 10BC fire extinguisher if the pleasure craft is equipped with a fuel burning cooking, heating or refrigerating appliance

Distress Equipment:

A watertight flashlight

12 Canadian approved flares of type A, B, C or D. Not more than 6 can be Class D.

Navigation Equipment:

Two sound signaling appliances (bell or whistle).

Navigation Lights that meet the applicable standards set out in the Collision Regulations.

A reminder to all members using **power** on the docks to check that they have the correct cord end for the outlet. Boats normally come with a 30 amp cord end and since most of our outlets on G, H and B are 20 amp, they require an adaptor.
