

PAST COMMODORE REPORT

JULY 2018 ENTRY ... BRIAN JAMIESON

Some of you may have read that the Kelowna Rowing Club was looking for a space near the waterfront to store their sculls and associated rowing gear. Steve Enns, Alan James and I met with Leslie Manders and other directors of the Kelowna Rowing Club along with representatives from the City of West Kelowna to discuss whether or not we had a suitable location at the West Kelowna Yacht Club (WKYC).

The area between the public launch and the Pendozi was thought to be a suitable site for this purpose. After meeting on site and discussing this option further, a tentative agreement was reached.

The area selected is from the existing moorage fencing by the Pendozi kitchen, and continues along the side of the Pendozi for about 54 feet (16.5 metres) and is bordered by the public launch boardwalk and the Pendozi. This area is part of the WKYC District Lot 5472 and is presently landscaped as an irrigated lawn.

The City of West Kelowna has indicated that they would cover the cost of re-landscaping this area to remove the grass and prepare the site for scull storage and the Kelowna Rowing Club will pay for the fencing required to secure their equipment. There should not be any expense for the WKYC.

As the Kelowna Rowing Club requires a safety boat at all times when rowers are active, we will also provide an area for them to moor their 14 foot boat near the sewage pump-out within our moorage basin. They will be charged the regular moorage rate for this use of our moorage basin.

The WKYC sees this opportunity as a win/win/win where the Kelowna Rowing Club has secure storage for some of their sculls near a public launch; the City of West Kelowna has helped to support this scenario; and the WKYC benefits by improved security with respect to the electrical facilities located on that side of the Pendozi which will be enclosed within the fenced compound. There is also a possibility of members from both organizations becoming members of the other if they so desire.

We have asked that the members of the Kelowna Rowing Club park their vehicles along Gellatly and use the public washrooms provided in that area. The usual time for their members to row is early in the morning so their activities are not expected to affect the WKYC or the public's use of the boat launch.


